21/113 Reports

Ward Cllrs. report from NELC – Cllr Swinburn:

- **Bridges have been repaired**
- **FOS have received £500 from ward funding and SYC have received £1250**
- **Funding starts again in May 2022**
- **3 months of Traffic lights as Super Cycle Highway develops**
- **A180 new resurfacing go ahead in 2024**

- While 40mph restrictions are on A180 NELC are making use of clearing out dykes etc
- Wild flower planting is approved from Barnetby top to Grimsby
- Decision made not to have a bin at the old layby as it attracts more rubbish but will monitor
- Cllr Sears to clarify which gate and pathway a parishioner wanted closed off and a gate put in.
- Cllr Hoyes declared an interest – South Marsh Road bridal way could be closed – Cllr Crofts, J Scott and Gilbert voted against closure
- To investigate if path at end of Matthew Ford Way near A180 does not have a footpath and sign
- Emergency plan: NELC have so many plans in place that cover the parish so we do not need to have one at parish level. Cllr Reed can enquire about emergency plans online if needed
- Cllr Sears asked for the bin behind bollards in Old Healing Road to be put in the turning of the road to stop littering

Shaping Stallingborough Meetings

- Network Rail agreed to hedges being planted on the field 2 mtrs away from fence line.
- Oak tree planting on field and school still going ahead hopefully around March time with a plaque on. Wording to be decided
- Notice board needed. Agreed to use windows for now, later to buy notice board indoor or outdoor.
- Littering picking day - SUS to ask Cllr Swinburn for more litter picking equipment and Cllr H Scott to give litter pickers to SUS. Can we ask NELC to litter pick verges along Healing road and other busy main roads
- Jubilee – Village Hall have a music licence, but can we use that on the playing field? Bar licence or Greenman involvement a possibility?? Discuss next month

ABP Presentation

To build new floating pontoons to service 4 cargo ships. Roll on, Roll off or (Roro).

Does not encroach or stop other existing companies or current oil terminal etc.

Cllr Crofts mentioned drainage as land would be concreted. ABP will not touch drainage already in place. Cllr Hoyes asked about mitigation land. They have marine surveys. Dredging will need to take place, they want to loose as little nature as possible so are staying as far away as possible from shore line.

300 units on and off per ship (each day?) so issues were raised with road usage through Immingham which would not be happening. Road noise on concrete A180. Immigrants coming in illegally – Border force already involved.

The question was raised “Where will all these Lorries stay over?” ABP are expecting extremely few amounts of stay overs but will look at the possibility of their own Lorry park and facilities which will need security.

ABP advised PC to look at website for announcements and questions as Stallingborough PC were the first PC to be consulted.

ABP are funding this themselves
