#### Parish Council Notes

The Parish Council has continued to meet via Zoom, holding virtual meetings on its usual scheduled meeting days. The public can log on and join in and the access code to the meeting is printed on the top of the Agenda for each meeting which is then posted on the Parish Council website.

The last two meetings held were for February and March 2021. There are still 2 vacancies on the Parish Council.

As a follow up to its quarterly Highways Meetings with NELC, a member of the Council and the Clerk held a 'walk round' to look at parking and highways issues within the Village and NELC will look to make some proposals and carry out some consultation around the issues discussed.

As usual, planning issues were discussed and also the Council is considering the repainting of the play equipment in the playground off Station Road.

All information is also available readily on our new website at stallingboroughparishcouncil.com. The is now revamped and is suitable for viewing on mobile devices also. All accounts, agendas etc. are published on the website.

Planning is still discussed at the virtual meetings, with members of the Council able to view plans on the NELC Planning Portal and comments are still submitted by the Parish Council.

Ward Cllrs. Stewart and Karen Swinburn attend the Parish Council meetings regularly and help the Council with issues within the Village.

At the moment members are unclear as to whether meetings in person will be allowed from May. The current legislation which allows us to meet virtually will cease in May 2021 and so the Council awaits instruction from central Government in what will happen with regard to Council meetings.

#### **Verge Wildflowering**

The loss of wild flower habitat for our pollinators over the last few decades has been immense. In recent years there has, however, been a campaign to sow wild flower seeds on road verges in order to go some way to compensate for this loss. This campaign has been very successful around the UK in recent years and the results of this can be best seen locally on the verges around the roundabout leading to Matthew Ford Way.

Looking at the possibility of doing such work in our village, a small group of people held discussions with the Parish Council about the possibility of wild flowering the entrance to our village. The council allowed us to pursue the idea of sowing seeds on two verges. This is a pilot project with, if it is deemed successful in helping pollinators and in making the entrance to the village look more inviting over the summer months, the aim being to sow more areas in future years. With regard to the work needed, the good people from the Ecology department of North East Lincs Council have been very helpful in agreeing that the preparatory needed will be done by the Council's Grounds department and also in advising on the type of seed needed.

The funding of the seed has come from donations from many kind people in the village and from a grant from a fund held by our ward councillor, Stewart Swinburn. The response to a request for funds posted on the village Facebook sites has been fantastic and our profound thanks go to everyone who has kindly donated.


