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## Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

At the last meetings, various planning applications were discussed, and these are shown in the minutes of each meeting which are published on the Parish Council's website.

The final snagging works to the play area resurfacing have now been completed and works have also now been carried out at the Pavilion, with repairs to roofing, guttering etc. and some remedial works inside. The Council is hoping to utilise this building more in the future especially around events on the field etc.

The Platinum Jubilee Celebrations have now been scheduled and you will see posters and advertisements for this elsewhere in the Newsletter, around the Village and on social media so please keep a watch out for these.

The Council has also successfully bid for some national lottery funding and has received funds for some new equipment at the playing fields with a zip wire top of the list for installation. The Parish Council now has an ongoing commitment to enhancing the park area for residents.

Also, for the Summer, the Council is organising holiday clubs for one session a week in the Summer holidays at the park. These will be free for local children to attend and further details will be in the next edition of the Newsletter.



#### Hello Everyone,

Isn't it lovely to see all the spring flowers and hear the birds singing – spring has sprung!

I think that everyone enjoyed our 100<sup>th</sup> birthday party in January. We had a delicious buffet and were entertained by Meadowsong a ladies choir. Our celebratory cake was beautifully decorated by one of our members, Glenis Foster-Isaacs.

The handmade flowers are now all attached to the large planter in the Community Garden (and are still attached after the three named storms we had recently!) It is a wonderful, colourful sight to behold, congratulations to all who contributed to the project, it was well worth the sleepless nights!

On February 3<sup>rd</sup> Father Herbert Fadriquela told us about his work as the Humber Port Missionary at Immingham, he is also the chaplain for the ports of Felixstowe, Harwich, Grimsby, Goole, Hull, Ipswich and South Killingholme. He welcomes the seafarers, 90% of the things we use come to us by sea and there are 1.5 million seafarers around the world. He explained that the seafarers are some of the most unsung of workers in one of the most dangerous and lonely jobs. They face many difficulties including shipwreck, piracy and being forced to be away from home for up to twelve months. Often there is no internet connection and their ship can become like a prison. Father Herbert's job is to provide practical, spiritual and welfare assistance.

We were let loose with clay at our March meeting- Pam Harrison showed us how to make hears, flowers etc to decorate and hang either indoors or in the garden. Most ladies rolled out clay and produced decorated items which Pam took home to fire and will be returned in time for our next meeting. It was a most enjoyable evening with lots of talking- just for a change!!
