## Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

The Council met as usual for February and March 2023 and minutes are on our website. Ward Cllrs. attended both recent meetings.

A quarterly meeting with Highways was held at the end of January 2023 and the next one will be held during the next month or so.

Various planning applications were discussed and all planning applications discussed at the PC meetings are available to view on the NELC website at [www.nelincs.gov.uk](http://www.nelincs.gov.uk). You just go to the Planning Applications, agree the terms and conditions and then you can input the planning application reference number or the address and it will bring up the documents for you to view.

The Parish Council has now completely overhauled the heating system at the Hall, with new pipework and two new boilers ensuring the Hall is now lovely and warm for the users.

Ongoing works are being done to the Pavilion which will be used for various events this Summer and there is still some outstanding decorating at the Village Hall to be done. There have been improvements to the play area from Shaping Up Stallingborough and there are still some repairs to the trim trail needed on the playing field.

The Council is also looking at improving the suspended ceiling within the Village Hall to bring it in line with the new programme of decoration.

### Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report March 23

#### Crime

There were 67 crimes across the Ward for Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough but no incidents occurring in Stallingborough Village.

Incidents on the industrial estates included forced entry into the grounds of a chemical factory and earthing wire stolen along with some other property.

Other crime include:

On two occasions thieves targeted the same business on Immingham Dock. On the first occasion they stole various items including metals. The next day they used a forklift to lift a generator on to their vehicle before leaving the site.

On another occasion a different company was targeted on the dock. This time, plant machinery was stolen. Four shop thefts.

Two making of without payment for fuel.

Twelve assaults.

Ten reports of harassment.

Five reports of sending malicious communications.

Eight minor public order incidents.

## ELECTION INFORMATION FOR MAY 2023

### Voting Changes for elections

The first Thursday in May will see local Council elections and also Parish and Town Council elections. Some of you may already have seen the advertising which the Government is carrying out regarding voter ID. From this May, 2023, you will not be able to vote on voting day unless you have photographic ID with you.

This includes a driving licence, passport, local authority photo travel pass. If you don't have one of these forms of identity, then you can obtain a Voter ID card which you can then produce when you go to vote. To obtain a voter ID card you need to go online to do so and/or download a paper form which you can send off.

For anyone who doesn't have access to the internet, or cannot complete the form, then do please give the Parish Council Clerk, Kathy, a call on 07494 577661 and we can help you do this.

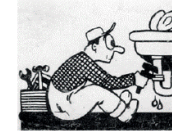

Phone 'n' Ride has provided a regular service from Stallingborough to Immingham every Friday.

Since last Autumn, there has been a reduction in passenger numbers, and since Christmas, the Friday service from Stallingborough to Immingham has carried only 1 passenger who travelled both ways. The Friday service from Stallingborough to Immingham will no longer operate after Friday 31 March (this day will be the final Friday service).

The regular Phone 'n' Ride service from Stallingborough to Morrisons and Grimsby, which operates on a Tuesday would remain unchanged.
