

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS FROM NELC:

Grass cutting of verges will be carried out by NELC this Summer every 3 weeks and this was confirmed by NELC.

The layby on Riby Road is the subject of a permanent stopping up order and will be permanently closed officially when the Order takes effect.

The Council is being affected by staff having to self isolate and is redeploying some of its staff to ensure that services are maintained at their usual levels. Priority is being given to waste services which at the moment have remained unaffected with regard to collecting waste.

However, the delivery of new bins to new households or replacement bins to replace those damaged or stolen do now have a considerable back log and the wait for that particular service is currently around 6 weeks. NELC is doing all it can to reduce these waiting times.





It would appear that we have been overtaken by circumstances on this one, as East Coast operator LNER are giving serious consideration to extending the existing Kings Cross to Lincoln service to Cleethorpes next year and although hopes have been dashed before, the chances of this coming about this time appear much brighter.

Needless to say if the service goes ahead BCCRP will press for a stop at Habrough, so as to connect with Barton-Cleethorpes trains.



It seems likely that St. Peter and St. Paul Church will not re-open for regular church services once the pandemic ends. This seems inevitable as the regular, mostly elderly congregation has diminished to single figures, elderly, it is simply not viable to keep it open. Following the closure of the Primitive Methodist chapel many years ago and the recent closure of the Wesleyan Chapel it will mean there will be no suitable place for Christian worship which began in the village 1400 years ago. The first people to settle here were the Saxons. They built a church on the site of the present church- a small plateau knoll which stands 21 feet (O.S bench mark) above the high and low Humber tides. At neap tide the estuary once regularly flooded the extensive marshland to the North of the church. The knoll prevented the egress of flood water to the south of the church and here the Saxons, the first people to settle here built their village. Their church, built Circa 780. A.D. was the centre of this... Chronicles in the Lincoln Archives record that Offa, the Christian King of Mercia and Wessex worshipped here in 786 A.D.

After the Battle f Hastings William the Conqueror gave extensive lands at Stallingborough to Norman de Arci, one of his foremost allies. He built a Manor House near to the church and converted the Saxon church into a Norman building which fell down in 1746/ An entry in the Lincolnshire Topographer reads 'Stallingborough Church being built of bad materials not withstanding the care and attention of the inhabitants fell down on a very calm day.'

The village was granted a 'brief' by parliament n 1753 which enabled the church to impose a local tax to fund the building of the Georgian church. It was twenty years after the 'brief' that enough funding was available to begin to build.. The present church is a treasure trovd of historical artefacts and data. These include memorials to the famous Ayscough (Askewe) family.

It will be very sad to witness its closure ..

We had hoped to restart our meetings on July 1st but a four week extension of the Covid restrictions put a stop to that!




