Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

At the last meetings, various planning applications were discussed, and these are shown in the minutes of each meeting which are published on the Parish Council's website.

The Council has now completed its refurbishment of the Pavilion in the playing fields and has now had a new garage door fitted. Cllr. Ian Sears has now taken on the light grounds maintenance of the play park grass cutting and the village hall grounds and community garden tidying and equipment has been purchased for him to do this. By the Council doing the work, funding saved will now be put to village projects etc. to enhance the life of the Village. These will be done in conjunction with the Shaping Up Stallingborough Group.

The play park received its annual inspection and, thanks to the refurbishment works carried out by the Council, passed the inspection with flying colours.

The Village Hall has been scheduled for redecoration and this should be carried out over the next few weeks.

The Council has now completed all of its annual return paperwork for the external auditors and this has now been submitted to the auditors, PKF Littlejohn Ltd. All of the information is available on our website, including the dates for public inspection of the accounts should any resident wish to do so.
