## Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

The Council met as usual during June and July. Other meetings were also held such as Town and Parish Liaison Committee and ERNLLCA District Committee with the Council represented at these through either Council members or the Clerk attending.

Various planning applications were discussed and all planning applications discussed at the PC meetings are available to view on the NELC website at [www.nelincs.gov.uk](http://www.nelincs.gov.uk). You just go to the Planning Applications, agree the terms and conditions and then you can input the planning application reference number or the address and it will bring up the documents for you to view.

Ongoing improvement works to facilities continue with replacement baby s wings for the playground, some additional tables and electrical sockets at the village hall and a new suspended ceiling at the Hall to continue its refurbishment programme.

The Council is also formalising the arrangements with its allotment site and starting a new waiting list for those interested in taking an allotment and confirming insurance arrangements for those on the site.

Note that there will be no scheduled August meeting for the Summer break.

## **Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for July**

### **Crime**

There were 71 crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area in April.

During the early hours of 8<sup>th</sup> June, a home on Pinfold Lane Stallingborough was broken into by forcing entry through the patio doors. Cash was stolen.

A domestic related burglary occurred on 14<sup>th</sup> June at an address in Stallingborough whereby a family relation visited the address and stole a bank card. He later tried to use the card to fuel his car but the payment was declined as the victim froze the card.

### **Business & commercial Burglary:**

During the early hours of 3<sup>rd</sup> June, a compound within the fire station carpark at Stallingborough was broken into. A quad bike was stolen.

## HAZARDOUS PLANTS

Unfortunately, Giant Hogweed plants have established themselves in Stallingborough this summer.

Contact with these plants can cause long lasting skin lesions to people and pets alike.

The plants are characterised by their height, up to 3 metres, their distinctive thickened purple stems and the “umbrella” floral array.
