Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

At the last meetings, various planning applications were discussed, and these are shown in the minutes of each meeting which are published on the Parish Council's website.

The Council has now coopted a new member, Cllr. John Scott, and there was one existing vacancy remaining, but a candidate has come forward to be considered for cooption at the December 21 meeting. If this candidate is successful, it will bring the membership back up to its 9 members.

Refurbishment of the play area on Station Road has now been completed, although there are aspects of the new soft surfacing which the Council isn't happy with and is looking into. A recent playground inspection has taken place and the only remaining action is to have the small gates to the area repaired. The trim trail is now fully installed and the Council is looking at further improvements to the playing fields with possible refurbishment of the Pavilion building being considered. A full tree survey has also been commissioned on trees on the playing field and the results of that survey are awaited.

The Remembrance Day service was held on Sunday 14th November and afterwards, for the first time, the Council welcomed members of the public back to the village hall for some refreshments.

Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for

October 2021

Crime

There were 76 crimes recorded for September in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT. These included:

A male has been charged with burglary after he entered the premises of Little London Motors and stole a set of car keys.

On 12th September barns at Mauxhall Farm were entered. Damage was caused when wheat grain was thrown outside and left to spoil.

On 3rd September a Subaru Forrester was stolen from the driveway of an address on Church Lane. The vehicle was later found burnt out. On 5th September a male stole some keys from a car sales which were used to later steal a car. He was later charged with this offence.

A car that had been left in a layby on the A180 after it had broken down was stolen. Overnight 12th & 13th September.

An employee drove a works vehicle home and failed to return to work. The employee later stated that the vehicle had been stolen.

Litter Pick 6th November



Multi-trip tickets issued by Stagecoach (Megarider/Dayrider tickets are **not valid** on-board Phone 'n' Ride).

Can I use my bus pass on the Phone n Ride service?

Yes! Holders of a valid National Concessionary Fare Bus Pass can use the service for free! Please show your valid travel pass to the driver when boarding.

Mobility Issues

Should you have a mobility issue and find it difficult to walk to one of the designated bus stops, you will need to give the booking team a call to register first and then arrange a pick up nearer to your home. Journeys for passengers with mobility issues can be booked up to 14 days in advance subject to availability. All our vehicles are suitable for passengers requiring wheelchair access, prior to travel a wheelchair CPT assessment would be required with Stagecoach East Midlands.

The regular timetable bus service is all about convenience, giving opportunity for residents to travel more freely, go shopping, attend doctors' appointments, visiting friends. The regular weekly bus service will start with effect from **Tuesday 3rd August 2021.**

<u>Q & A</u>

Do I have to be registered to use the regular timetable service?

No, you do not have to be registered to travel on the regular timetable service, please wait at one of the designated bus stop(s). Hop on and away you go! (Please refer to published timetable)

How much will it cost to travel from Stallingborough to Immingham?

£1.30 Adult Fare

65p Child Fare (children under age 5 travel free)




