Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

The Council met as usual for October and November and the November meeting saw a presentation from representatives regarding the proposed Green Energy Terminal Project at Immingham. Details were discussed and a timeline for the application presented.

A quarterly meeting has been held with the new Traffic Team Manager at NELC and any outstanding highways matters carried forward for NELC's attention. The Parish Council has requested that attention be paid to PROW surfaces within the Parish.

Various planning applications were discussed and all planning applications discussed at the PC meetings are available to view on the NELC website at www.nelincs.gov.uk. You just go to the Planning Applications, agree the terms and conditions and then you can input the planning application reference number or the address and it will bring up the documents for you to view.

The ongoing problems with heating at the Village Hall have been addressed with the pipework for the boiler now redone and all above ground to ease repairs etc. The old system appeared to have a leak on pipework below ground and hopefully this will now help the issue. Some minor repairs to the boiler are also required and these will hopefully be done shortly.

Some repairs to the trim trail on the park are awaited and SUS Stallingborough are working hard to improve facilities on the playground and park area.

We are part of the Wolds Gateway Group of Churches and services are held every Sunday at either Keelby or Healing for anyone wish ing to attend.


