The Parish Council does bring in revenue through the hire of the Hall and this is around £8,500 per year dependent upon number of hirings.			
Precept Set for 24/25 £50,000			
This will incur an increase to each household, with Band D taken as an average, the increase will be approx. £11.30 per year which is approximately 95 pence per month per household.			

Stallingborough Parish Council

Budget and Precept Information for fy 24/25

The Parish Council met in January 2024 to set its budget for the coming financial year of 24/25 and also set the precept requirement for Stallingborough Village, which it then needs to submit to NELC by the end of January each year.

The budget set for fy 24/25 is as follows:

Administration

£3,980

This includes fees to NALC, our County Association, stationery and office costs, website and IT provision, courses and training, ClIrs. Expenses, our audit fees each year, the Christmas tree disposal, bank charges and insurance for the year—both public liability and employers' liability insurance.

Staffing

£21,000

This includes all staff members—there are currently 4 permanent staff members and also a casual bar staff member. The budget includes all PAYE obligations and salaries are set at national levels. This budget also includes provision for an additional member of staff to work as a dedicated litter picker for Stallingborough Village.

Grant Aid/Newsletter

£2,840

This covers grant aid to village groups and printing and distribution of the Village Newsletter.
