Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

The Council met as usual for December and then January 2023 with the January meeting dealing with budget setting and precept setting for the coming financial year 23/24.

A follow on quarterly meeting with Highways from NELC will be held at the end of January and any outstanding matters followed up.

Various planning applications were discussed and all planning applications discussed at the PC meetings are available to view on the NELC website at www.nelincs.gov.uk. You just go to the Planning Applications, agree the terms and conditions and then you can input the planning application reference number or the address and it will bring up the documents for you to view.

The Parish Council has now arranged for two new boilers at the Village Hall to go with the new pipework which has now been installed. Heating problems have persisted for some time now and so the new boilers should solve the problem and ensure the Hall is warm for hirers. This work should be done by the end of January 2023.

Some repairs to the trim trail on the park are awaited and SUS Stallingborough are working hard to improve facilities on the playground and park area.

Crime

In December there were sixty five crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT. These included:

Residential Burglary:

During the early hours of 20th December three males knocked on the door of a home on Healing Road, Stallingborough. As the door was opened by the elderly resident, the three males forced entry. The resident was threatened and assaulted. The three males made off from the scene with various items of property. During the early hours of 31st December, a male reached into a bathroom window in an attempt to gain entry. He was disturbed and no entry was made.

There were various incidents on the industrial estates including attempted burglary and car crime.

ELECTION INFORMATION FOR MAY 2023

The first Thursday in May will see local Council elections and also Parish and Town Council elections. Some of you may already have seen the advertising which the Government is carrying out regarding voter ID.

From this May, 2023, you will not be able to vote on voting day unless you have photographic ID with you.

This includes a driving licence, passport, local authority photo travel pass. If you don't have one of these forms of identity, then you can obtain a Voter ID card which you can then produce when you go to vote.

To obtain a voter ID card you need to go online to do so and/or download a paper form which you can send off.

Thanks to the East Coast Community Fund, we



Just go to Report It on the homepage and follow the links. You will get a Customer Reference Number which will allow you to follow up the report. The precept is set around a Council Tax Base figure which is not set by the Parish Council but by NELC. The base figure for S tallingborough Village for the coming year is 444.52.

£45,000 for the year 23/24.

This an increase on previous years' precepts and the breakdown is shown below for each houseband. The amounts may vary by a penny or two when rounded up or down by NELC, but the precept amount for each house is shown below:

Budget and Precept setting for 2023/2024

The Parish Council considered its budget for the coming financial year at its January 2023 meeting and wishes to continue providing improved facilities for residents in the Village. The Council did acknowledge that it has possibly under-precepted for the last few years in an attempt to keep costs down for residents but a programme of improvements to the playground and playing field, the Pavilion building and the Village Hall has resulted in the Council using the bulk of its reserves and still with more upgrading of facilities to be done, the Parish Council has resolved to increase the precept by a substantial amount for this coming year.

Budget for 23/24

Administration

£4,010

This includes insurances, subscriptions/memberships to local county associations, office charges including telephones and computers etc., the website, compulsory audit fees, training and courses and some footway budget.

Staffing

£17,500

This covers 4 staff members and salaries are not yet by the Parish Council but nationally and also any PAYE, pensions etc. is included in this sum

Grant Aid/Newsletter

£2,140.00

This covers any grants to local groups the Council may make and also the printing and distribution costs of the Parish Council Newsletter which is produced 6 times each year.

Village Hall costs

This covers all utilities such as heating, lighting and electricity, water bills, any business rates, insurances for the building, all cleaning materials costs, hygiene services, repairs and maintenance and equipment costs and commercial waste disposal.

Bar costs £275

This is a minimal amount allocated as the bar funds itself usually with stocking and staffing costs met by the proceeds of the previous bar hirings.

Playing Fields/Pavilion £4,450

This bulk of this is the grass cutting on the playing field, but also covers water and electricity costs for the Pavilion and any repairs/maintenance to the playground and trees etc., including an annual playground inspection.

Capital/Special Projects £14,200

These include, for the coming year, a fund for Shaping up Stallingborough to use for projects/events, essential tree safety works to the playing field, further pavilion refurbishment, decorating in the Village Hall, playpark improvements, improvements to some land adjacent to the allotment site and payment of contractors to carry out maintenance in the Churchyard each month.
