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## Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

At the last meetings, various planning applications were discussed, and these are shown in the minutes of each meeting which are published on the Parish Council's website. At the January meeting a presentation was received from ABP regarding the Immingham Eastern Terminal development and there is further information on this application elsewhere in this issue.

The Council has another newly coopted member in Mrs. Julie Hoyes. Cllr. Hoyes was coopted at the January 2022 meeting of the Council.

Refurbishment of the play area on Station Road had been completed but the Parish Council has requested that some of the soft surfacing be relaid as it was not happy with the standard of works carried out. That was being done as this Newsletter went to print. The Council has also commissioned some repair works to the Sports Pavilion on the Park and these will be completed during February 2022, with roofing repairs, new guttering and drainage works etc. The Council also continues to be represented at quarterly highways meetings held with NELC and works closely with its Ward Cllrs.

In December 2021, the Council agreed its budget for the coming financial year 22/23 and also set the precept requirement for Stallingborough Village for 22/23. Further information is printed elsewhere in the Newsletter.

**Chargers and devices...**

- Only buy manufacturer approved chargers for your products. Don't be tempted to buy cheaper, unbranded and possibly counterfeit chargers from traders or online.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- All manufacturers and importers are required to ensure that electrical items they supply are fitted with UK three-pin plugs with the proper fuse.
- Charge your device when you are awake, not when you are sleeping.
- Switch off at the socket and unplug once you have finished charging.
- Keep all chargers clear of fabrics or anything that could cover them. Do not have your charging device on your bed while you sleep.

**E- Cigarettes...**



- Always use a compatible charger and follow the instructions provided by the manufacturer carefully.
- Do not over tighten the atomiser when connecting an e-cigarette to the charger.
- Ensure that e-cigarettes are not left charging for long periods of time. Remove the battery when charged to prevent overcharging.
- Never leave e-cigarettes plugged in overnight or when you are out of the house.

## Have your say

THE public are invited to attend an exhibition as part of a consultation on the proposed Immingham Eastern Ro-Ro Terminal at the Port of Immingham.

Associated British Ports (ABP), whose Humber ports contribute £2.5 billion to the UK economy each year, is submitting a proposal to construct a new roll-on roll-off (ro-ro) facility within the eastern side of the port.

The North Sea ro-ro freight market is a significant and long-established trade route between the UK and continental Europe, and the Humber has a very strong presence in this market sector.

A Development Consent Order (DCO) application is to be submitted in summer 2022 and the new facility will comprise on the marine side a new jetty, with up to four berths and on the land side, improved hardstanding, Terminal buildings, and an internal site bridge which will cross over existing port infrastructure, including an ABP controlled railway track.

The public consultation runs from Wednesday 19 January 2022 to Wednesday 23 February 2022. There will be a public exhibition when the plans can be viewed, and questions asked. These will be held at Immingham Civic Centre on Monday 24 January, 3pm to 7pm, and Saturday 05 February, 10am to 2pm. Port tenants and customers can view the plans at the Seafarers Centre on Wednesday 26 January, 1pm to 5pm, and Thursday 27 January, 9am to 3pm.

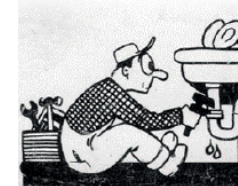

## Stallingborough Parish Council

### Budget and Precept Information

#### For Financial Year 22-23

The Parish Council has set its budget for the coming financial year 22-23 and has also set the precept requirement for Stallingborough Village for 22.23.

The budget figures are as follows:

#### Administration **£3,600**

This includes insurance, subscriptions to outside bodies, stationery, office expense, website and IT provision, training for both staff and Council members, telephone costs and some highways expenditure.

#### Staffing **£15,500**

This covers 4 members of staff and covers all pension and PAYE requirements. Staff are paid according to nationally set scales.

#### Grant Aid/Newsletter **£1,625**

This covers the printing and distribution of the Newsletter bi-monthly and also any grant aid given to any village group etc.

#### Village Hall Costs **£8,925**

This covers all day to day routine maintenance of the Hall, energy and water bills, non domestic repairs and insurance for the Hall, outside maintenance and provision for waste disposal.

#### Bar Costs **£0,275**

This only covers licence and supervision of bar accounts/stocking by a Council Officer. All staff costs and purchase of stock is covered through bar hirings and receipts etc.

#### Playing Fields **£5,000**

This covers all grass cutting, minor other maintenance, some play equipment maintenance and bin emptying and minor repairs as required.

#### Capital Projects

**£18,000**

The Parish Council has taken on several projects to improve and enhance village facilities for residents and the above amount includes the following projects/schemes etc.

Support for Shaping Stallingborough Group	£ 500
Events/Jubilee Event	£1,000
Essential tree works to field	£3,000
Pavilion Refurbishment	£7,000
Decorating main Village Hall room	£1,000
Playpark improvements/extra equipment	£3,000
Allotment site works	£ 500
Churchyard maintenance	£2,000

The total budget overall was set at £52,925 for the year.

The precept was then set at £29,000 for the year for Stallingborough Village.
