Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

At the last meetings, various planning applications were discussed, and these are shown in the minutes of each meeting which are published on the Parish Council's website.

The Parish Council members have been working really hard to finish the refurbishments to the Pavilion on the playing fields so that this building can be made better use of for community events etc. Council members have been volunteering and doing the work themselves along with help from the Shaping Stallingborough Group.

By the time you read this Newsletter the events for the Jubilee may already have taken place and updates will be in the next edition of the Newsletter as well as on our social media pages. The events have been advertised widely throughout the village in the run up to the Jubilee.

The Council had now ordered the zip wire for the playing fields and is awaiting delivery and installation. It will also be looking at further funding to provide more equipment if possible.

Also, for the Summer, the Council is trying to organise holiday clubs but at the moment is waiting for confirmation from the providers to see if its request can be accommodated in their provision for the summer.

There is still one remaining vacancy on the Council so anyone who may be interested should come along to a Council meeting.

The Council is undertaking its audit regime in late May/early June and this will be updated via the Newsletter and the website.

Crime

There were 78 crimes recorded for April in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT. These included:

Residential Burglary:

An unoccupied house on Mauxhall Farm, Stallingborough Road has been entered and extensive damage caused when electrical wiring has been ripped out.

Commercial Burglary:

During the early hours of 16th April, three persons have broken into the Home Bargains store after smashing a window. Wheelie bins were used to remove property from the store.

A fence panel was damaged at a garden on Church Lane.

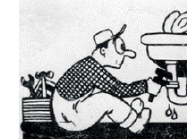

Stallingborough Village Grounds Maintenance Update

For 2022/23 the Parish Council has decided not to use an official grounds maintenance contract and instead is trying a new scheme . From May 2022, Cllr. Ian Sears will be looking after the grass cutting on the small play park as well as the village hall grounds and the community garden with equipment which the Parish Council has purchased. The expenditure then saved on the monthly grounds maintenance fee which the Council were paying to a contractor, will then be used directly on village benefits in liaison with the Shaping Stallingbrough Group.

The main large grassed area on the playing fields will continue to be cut by the long-standing contractors, Groundboss Ltd. as this is too big an area for the volunteers to deal with.

This initiative came from Cllr. Sears and the equipment has now been purchased by the Council and Shaping Stallingbrough are also helping in liaison with the Council on this scheme.

The funding usually spent on the minor grounds maintenance items has now been ring-fenced and will be used to bring direct benefit to the village.
