Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

The Council met as usual during April and May—with May being the first meeting post-election and also seeing the Annual Parish Meeting for Stallingborough village. The elections have returned 8 Council members out of a possible 9 seats, so there remains a vacancy on the Parish Council. All members are the same as those pre-election. Cllr. Gilbert is once again the Chairman for the year and Cllr. Crofts the Vice -Chair.

A quarterly meeting with Highways was held again towards the end of May with any issues discussed and passed to NELC for consideration/action.

Various planning applications were discussed and all planning applications discussed at the PC meetings are available to view on the NELC website at www.nelincs.gov.uk. You just go to the Planning Applications, agree the terms and conditions and then you can input the planning application reference number or the address and it will bring up the documents for you to view.

Ongoing works are being done to the Pavilion with new ceiling and kitchen etc. There have been improvements to the play area from Shaping Up Stallingborough and there are still some repairs to the trim trail needed on the playing field.

The Council is also looking at improving the suspended ceiling within the Village Hall to bring it in line with the new programme of decoration.
