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Parish Council Notes

The Council is still meeting at the Village Hall in person on the second calendar Wednesday of each month. WE meet either in the main Hall or the rear lounge area. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

At the last meetings, various planning applications were discussed, and these are shown in the minutes of each meeting which are published on the Parish Council's website.

The Council now has an applicant for one of its casual vacancies and will be looking to coopt a new member at the next available meeting. There will still be a vacancy on the Council for any other residents who may be interested. Please come along to a meeting or contact either the Clerk or an existing Council member for further details.

Refurbishment of the play area on Station Road has been the Council's main focus of attention over the past few weeks. All repairs have now been carried out and all of the equipment has now been refurbished and repainted. The trees overhanging the play area have now been trimmed back and a new, bigger bin is on order to replace the small one on site.

The new safety surfacing will hopefully have been installed by the time you read this edition of the Newsletter and that will see the refurbishment of the playpark completed.

Crime

There were 59 crimes recorded for August in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

- Persons removed a perimeter fence to gain entry into a yard at the Stallingborough Industrial Estate. They unhitched a tractor unit from a trailer, then hitched up a tractor unit they brought with them to the trailer and drove away from the site



Bonfires and Fireworks

Keep everyone at a safe distance

Bonfires
We actively encourage the public to attend an organised display

- ✓ Keep everyone at a safe distance from the fire
- ✓ Bonfires should be on open ground at least 15 metres away from houses, fences, sheds, trees or overhead cables etc. Always keep bonfires small
- ✓ Always check bonfires for nesting animals and other wildlife before lighting
- ✗ Whoever is supervising the fire should not drink alcohol
- ✓ Never leave bonfires unattended
- ✓ Water should be readily available to control the fire. If the fire becomes out of control call 999 immediately and ask for the fire service
- ✗ Never use accelerants on a bonfire, i.e. petrol, paraffin or aerosols

Fireworks
We actively encourage the public to attend an organised display

- ✓ Keep everyone at a safe distance during celebrations
- ✗ Never leave fireworks unattended. Never go back to a firework once it has been lit
- ✓ If using sparklers, always wear gloves
- ✓ Keep pets inside during bonfire and firework celebrations

Valkyrie Wilderness Workshops

Valkyrie Wilderness Workshops, based in Keelby, was founded in 2020 by Army Veteran Steve Baxter with the aim of providing support to Armed Forces Veterans and others in the community struggling with mental health issues, isolation or addiction. Participants take part in a variety of activities at our rural basecamp, 'Valhalla', and through these can choose to share their problems with others and gain peer support. Our support programmes are free of charge to those who need them. The activities we regularly undertake include axe & knife throwing, wood tattooing, woodworking and archery. Participants in our recent projects have also undertaken groundwork and construction on the site. Our future plans involve a full renovation of a barn which forms part of the site into a Viking-themed indoor space. This project will be led by local interior designer Rob Fawcett, who has recently featured on BBC2's Saved and Remade series. People joining our Wilderness Wellbeing Workshops will have the opportunity to be involved in this work if they wish, learning new skills from Rob. We are also developing a pond on site for fishing, which we hope to have completed in the next few months, and plans are also in place for opening a Men in Sheds Group in the near future. Our open workshops will commence in June and take place every Tuesday, and are part funded by a grant from the National Lottery Community Fund. Once a month we run weekend camps for Armed Forces Veterans, supporting those who are experiencing mental health difficulties or personal problems relating to their service. Participants undertake a day of activities before sitting down around the campfire in the evening to share their experiences. For 2021 we are inviting local businesses to sponsor our camps, or individuals to sponsor a Veteran's place on one of our camps. To help fund our work we run open Axe & Knife Throwing sessions on Wednesdays 6pm-8pm and Saturdays 10am-12pm. Sessions cost £15 for adults and £10 for 12-16s. Our axe range is also available for private bookings for groups of over 8 people. Should you have a mobility issue and find it difficult to walk to one of the designated bus stops, you will need to give the booking team a call to register first and then arrange a pick up nearer to your home. Journeys for passengers with mobility issues can be booked up to 14 days in advance subject to availability. All our vehicles are suitable for passengers requiring wheelchair access, prior to travel a wheelchair CPT assessment would be required with Stagecoach East Midlands.

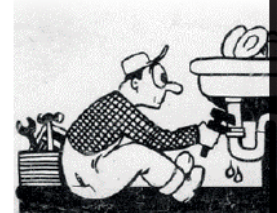
