Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

For September 2022 the Parish Council meeting was postponed owing to the days of national mourning. The summons to each Parish Council meeting has to be issued with 'clear days' of notice between the publication of the agenda and the actual meeting date and those days fell on days of national mourning so therefore were not valid as 'clear days'. Thus the earliest the Council could have met would have been w/c 26th September so it was agreed to move to the regular scheduled October meeting date of Wednesday 12th October 2022.

During the course of the month though, the Parish Council received its closure of its annual audit with the paperwork returned from the external auditors in London. The only issue raise was a mistake in transposing some figures on the actual form submitted, but the accounts themselves were endorsed and approved under their limited assurance guarantee. All financial paperwork, including the closure of the Audit is available on our website .


