Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

Ongoing improvement works to facilities have been continuing with further works to the Pavilion, the new ceiling tiles have now been installed in the Hall, extra tables purchased and some more electrical sockets in the Hall. There is also now a proper baby change station installed in the Village Hall.

The Council is also formalising the arrangements with its allotment site and starting a new waiting list for those interested in taking an allotment and confirming insurance arrangements for those on the site.
