### **Stallingborough Report for FEBRUARY 2025**

There have been sixty two crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area for February. Of these, the following have occurred.

#### **Domestic Burglary:**

During the evening of 3<sup>rd</sup> February, a garage at a property on Immingham Road, Habrough was broken into. A search was made, but when the homeowner disturbed the intruders, they made off empty handed.

During the evening of 21<sup>st</sup> February, the old Immingham Motors car showroom on Stallingborough Road was broken into. Nothing was stolen. There have been seven incidents of ASB reported. Two reports of illegal riding of motorbikes around Immingham.

## **CHURCH NEWS – ST PETER AND ST PAUL, STALLINGBOROUGH**

Although this point in the year for our church, (i.e. between the notable Christian festivals of Christmas and Easter), is rather quiet on the services front, in the background the Parochial Church Council is starting to action as much as it can in view of the recent major church building and churchyard survey that highlighted quite a number of matters for attention regarding the church fabric both inside and outside. Usefully, the survey does differentiate between the timescales for remedial actions.

One of the commonly heard comments, (often from the guy in the pub), about the Church of England is that “it’s got loads of money”. That may very well be the case..... but the Church of England runs a national organization, puts on religious services, employs the clergy and issues lots of diktats about what we are allowed to do or not do in terms of dealing with a listed building; however the *Church of England doesn’t own the building* so funding for the repair, maintenance running of these historic community places has to be sourced from outside.

We are considering our options regarding one originally quite modest church monetary investment, that goes back to the early 1940s and its present value. The old paperwork mentions “tithes” and other such things which were involved with the last big Stallingborough estate owners – the Barne – family. Whilst this is not exactly “family silver” as it were, it may possibly have to be called in after 80 or so years to boost the contemporary building repairs and maintenance fund to cover some of the more urgently required work.

We are thinking ahead about Easter already and hope to have one of our special care home services in the week leading up to Easter Sunday. The “Save The Parish” faction within the C of E would dearly like to see more clergy available to look after parish needs including regular services.

On another tack entirely - have you ever wondered why Stallingborough Church is out on its own and not in the middle of the village? Well, put simply, it was originally in the middle of the village dwellings as one would expect but that was in medieval times. The Lord of the Manor at the time decided he wanted to increase his landscaped gardens around the very large manor house that stood near the church so the locals were moved off, that is physically displaced, to the area where the village now stands. Anybody who has looked at the very long term plans for possible housing developments in the area might have noted that Stallingborough Church might one day find itself in the centre once again of a much enlarged village in many years to come.
