The Council has now had its internal audit and will be sending all the information through now to its external auditors as required.

We would also like to thank the kind resident who has taken the time to look after them for us.







Some of you may have seen our newly appointed Litter Picker in the Village. This is a post initiated by the Parish Council and is a litter picker working a few hours each week only in Stallingborough and paid for by the Parish Council from its annual budget.

The person carrying out the role wears a hi-viz vest and has all the necessary equipment supplied by the Council. Feedback so far has been very positive and if anyone has any particular areas which become very littered, please let us know and we can ask our staff member to litter pick at that location.

The Parish Council does have a rota and is trying to ensure all of the village is covered by our litter picker over a 4/5 week rota.
