

# CHURCH NEWS – ST PETER AND ST PAUL, STALLINGBOROUGH

Stallingborough Church is a rare Georgian Church, opening in 1780 or thereabouts. Maybe you have noticed how different it looks, (being built of brick in a certain style), to other local parish churches. It is built on the foundations of a very much older stone church that collapsed. Recently we have contacted the "Georgian Society" based in London to show them this little gem of a building here in a far corner of Lincolnshire and hope to liaise with them further.

In relation to our church building and some of the repairs needed, a grant has been sought and awarded from the Archbishops' Council under the *Buildings for Mission MR&I Grants Fund*, all necessary List B permissions having been sought and gained from the Diocese via the Archdeacon's Office and a contractor having been lined up.

Visits from teams of bellringers to our church are still of interest within the bellringing community it seems. We had a large group of bellringers from Durham, (mostly seemingly in their 20s), visit us and play last month.

As some of you probably know, between 12<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> September, this year's National Heritage Open Days are being held. Norman Coffey, our Assistant Churchwarden, has registered with the organizers the special opening of the church from 12noon to 4pm during those days and there will be some displays of historical events that happened in and around Stallingborough
