Fault Reporting, NELC

If you have a fault to report, such as a pot hole, faulty street light, fly tipping etc. you can do it directly with NELC.

On their website at www.nelincs.gov.uk just go onto the Report It link which is on the home page.

You will then have a choice of categories, such as street cleaning, road repairs etc. and if you click on these then you can report the fault directly and they will acknowledge your request with a dedicated customer number etc. You can then track whether the repair has been carried out or your request actioned.
