Stallingborough Report for JANUARY 2025

There have been thirty eight crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area for December to date (18/12).

Intruders entered a building site off Stallingborough Road causing damage to security fencing in doing so. A fuel bowser and fuel reel were stolen. Four plant vehicles were then targeted for the fuel. Approx £2300 worth of diesel was stolen.

There has been one incident of ASB reported.

Motorbikes being ridden illegally on Stallingborough Road.

Although only one incident has been reported, we are aware of numerous issues of ASB around the Civic Centre, shops, and Hadleigh Road involving various groups of local youths. Officers are now identifying those involved in causing these issues and will be taking appropriate action. In the meantime, the message to parents is: 'Do you know where your child is? Do you know what they are up to?' If not, find out, before you get a knock on your door from officers.





Stallingborough Budget and Precept Setting

The Parish Council set its budget at the January 2025 meeting and also the precept requirement for the coming year 25/26.

Administration £4,210

This includes insurance, training, membership fees to NALC and the County Association and office costs.

Staffing £23,500

This covers 5 staff members including the Clerk, 3 x Caretakers and a litter picker along with PAYE, insurances etc.

Grant Aid/Newsletter £3,500

Covers grant aid to groups and also the printing and distribution of the newsletter.

Village Hall £11,000

This covers all energy costs, water bills, insurances, repairs and maintenance, decorating, licences, bin and cleaning materials etc.

Bar at Hall £270

This covers Bar Manager costs and licencing each year.

Playing Fields £4,075

Includes grass cutting, bin emptying, playground inspection and repairs and playground maintenance etc.

Plans for 2025

We plan to design a map of the village to be displayed at the station and other locations around the village. We would like to hold a walk around the village for residents and in the future, hope to add notice boards depicting key features in the village. Any more knowledgeable residents would be welcome in helping us put these together.

We also hope to organise a summer event, such as an outdoor theatre or sports activities utilising the money raised at last year's scarecrow festival and wreath making workshops. Please get in touch if you could help with organising something.

As always, we have many ideas and plans for the year but we can only go ahead with them all with your help and support. We are hoping to set up specific groups of residents who would be interested to help with specific tasks. The groups would either be on WhatsApp or email. An example would be 'Friends of the Community Orchard' which would meet as and when required to maintain the meadow and improve the area for wildlife.

CHURCH NEWS – ST PETER AND ST PAUL, STALLINGBOROUGH

New Year good wishes to all Stallingborough residents from your Parish Church!

December was a busy month with three Christmas Services and the church was decorated up including a large, beautiful Christmas tree very kindly donated by the Hoyes family.

Apart from the usual well attended Carol Service and Crib Service we had the third annual, specially dedicated service, for the "Home From Home" Care Home Group, some of whose residents live at the Old Vicarage next to the Church. Other residents came to the event from Group homes elsewhere in Lincolnshire.

This and the special Easter service have become yearly events now and the brilliant help from Healing Church and the dedicated carers from the care home group make it a memorable time at Stallingborough Church. The car park area and approach road were full to overflowing and this year the residents brought along their own "bells and shakers" to add to the Christmas music tracks we play through a specially set up Church PA system. These services are video'd by the Group and clips of this year's event in church and at the Village Hall are on YouTube. Bit of village fame - eh?

In the last twelve months along with funerals, wedding/Christening etc, we have had some more visitors from the USA; one of our churchwardens showed them round as they had a name very similar to Ayscough and, like our other American visitors, they were researching their ancestors. Our church is Grade II* listed which means, (with the *), "particularly special" and, (I assume), that's partly because of the Ayscough effigies in the Chancel area which are of great interest to our American guests.

In May last year a "Quinquennial", (five yearly building survey), inspection took place and much later in the year the 61 page report was issued. This is a serious(!) architectural read for the village's Georgian church and obviously a Grade II* listed building must be monitored very carefully. More about this to come.

Thinking about the year ahead at Stallingborough Church we have a normal service in March to start the year off on the services rota. The Wolds Gateway group of churches, of which we are a member is down to one ordained vicar now between all eight churches. "Save The Parish" is a well- established group in church circles who believe that significant change is needed within the Church of England. I find their website a very interesting read.
