Parish Council Notes

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.00 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

The Council met in April and May with May seeing the Annual Parish Council meeting and the Annual Parish Meeting for the Village of Stallingborough—at which members of the public were present.

Various planning applications were discussed and all planning applications discussed at the PC meetings are available to view on the NELC website at www.nelincs.gov.uk. You just go to the Planning Applications, agree the terms and conditions and then you can input the planning application reference number or the address and it will bring up the documents for you to view.

Various consultations and representations have been received on line and at the meetings from the various solar farms and energy park developments which are ongoing around the Stallingborough area.

All financial information is on our website and the internal audit for the fy 24-25 will take place in early June and then an external audit will be undertaken from July onwards with all necessary information submitted as required.

The Annual Report and Accounts for the Council year 1st April 2024 through to 31st March 2025 has now been published. It will be available on our website but if any resident would like to have a paper copy please contact the Clerk . There will be a small charge for a paper copy of the report.

Under the Op Yellowfin scheme to deter people from riding bikes antisocially we have referred to police systems to gather intelligence and issue warning letters to key addresses believed to with be involved with storing e-scooters and powered transport.

After concerns were raised, a talk was given to Year 6 pupils of Stalling-borough Primary school on the dangers of E-scooters, mopeds, and off-road bikes to educate that Police will be seizing the scooters moving forward as they are illegal. This will be a continued focus during May.

Your local Community Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area which we all live and work.

We encourage all residents to call and report any issues where they live so that we can deal with any issues and step up our patrols in the area.

Stallingborough Report for May 2025

There have been seventy nine crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area for April. Of these, the following have occurred.

Vehicle Crime:

Overnight 7th & 8th April a van was stolen from outside its home address on Station Road, Stallingborough.

During the afternoon of 8th April, two youths were disturbed as they attempted to steal a motorbike from The Catch, Stallingborough. They damaged the steering lock making it unable to be ridden away. The same youths then attempted to steal a second motorbike but were disturbed by staff. They made off on a motorbike they arrived on.

Here is a brief review of what your local officers have also been involved in during the past couple of months.

During March, our focus has been on tackling ASB and Drugs at the Civic Centre Retail Units and local Public Houses. We were supported by a specialist Drugs Dog that is trained to detect cannabis, ketamine, and cocaine. This resulted in a successful stop search and a no tolerance message being declared.

Our Police Surgery identified an increase in bike related offences. A report to police in the morning led to a stolen bike being located and returned to the owner that same afternoon. In April we have launched Op Agility which is a multiagency response to tackling antisocial behaviour and related crime. Humbertalking has shown that off road and nuisance bikes are still a priority for residents but a lot of this is going unreported. Officers have been out to engage with our community to remind people to report all issues so we can track the reports to be able to allocate the correct resources to tackle the concerns.

The next meetings of the Council will take place as shown and an Agenda for the meeting always appears on the Parish Council's website approximately one week prior to the meeting.





Station Updates





CHURCH NEWS – ST PETER AND ST PAUL, STALLINGBOROUGH

Just before the Easter weekend Stallingborough Church held another of its special care home services and residents and their carers took part in the Easter story service with the Reverend Chris Goldsmith of the Wolds Gateway group of churches officiating. Rev. Chris explained what Easter means and what happened all those years ago with accompanying sing-along songs and short hymns. As is usual with these services some members of the congregation travelled in from other parts of Lincolnshire and the church was full! For the organizers it was lovely to see not only the visitors but lots of familiar faces from our good neighbours and friends The Old Vicarage Care Home in Stallingborough.

Stallingborough Church is a rare Georgian Church, opening in 1780 or thereabouts. Maybe you have noticed how different it looks, (being built of brick in a certain style), to other local parish churches. It is built on the foundations of a very much older stone church which collapsed. Recently we have contacted the "Georgian Society" based in London to show them this little gem of a building here in a far corner of Lincolnshire and hope to liaise with them further.

As some of you probably know, between 12th to 21st September, this year's National Heritage Open Days are being held. Norman Coffey, our Assistant Churchwarden, has registered with the organizers the special opening of the church from 12noon to 4pm and during those days and there will be some displays of historical events that happened in and around Stallingborough and hopefully some village photos of bygone times; more details to follow nearer those September dates.

Sadly, we have had some very specific churchyard vandalism recently, resulting in a massive grave cross from a family set of graves being pushed over and smashing on the ground, missing an adjoining CWGC WW1 gravestone by inches. This must have been a peculiar and very bizarre determined effort by persons unknown as the broken pieces on the ground are exceptionally heavy to the point of unliftable by most people. Hopefully something may yet come to light as we have a Police Crime Number for this incident.
