

The Council meets every month, on the second calendar Wednesday of the month, at the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30 pm. Agendas are published a week before and are on our website. Members of the public are welcome to come along and attend.

The Council met in August for a Planning Meeting and then again in September for its usual scheduled meeting. The September meeting saw a presentation from ABP for a new proposed project which will sit on the Stallingborough boundary. Various consultations and representations have been received on line and at the meetings from the various solar farms and energy park developments which are ongoing around the Stallingborough area.

A newsletter distributor vacancy had been advertised on social media and we received several applications, with two distributors now appointed to share the distribution round Thanks to all those who applied.

The Council sent all of its financial information to the external auditors at PKF Littlejohn and feedback was now awaited.


